Low Income Housing/Section 8

Section 8 housing is now being called “housing voucher program” and the waiting list is closed throughout California due to the high demand for low income flexible housing. Depending on whether you are a senior, a veteran, desired area and household size they are accepting applications in Barstow, Victorville, San Bernardino, Colton, Grand Terrace and some other

DMV Placards or Plates

If you are having difficulty walking from the parking lot to the store, talk to your doctor or social worker at the dialysis unit about completing the REG 195 form which is an application signed by your doctor verifying a medical condition that limits your mobility. We have the forms on hand, or you can find them at dmv.ca.gov

Eyeglasses Through Lions

Friends in Sight, the Lion's club nonprofit outreach to help those who lack coverage and funds to afford eyeglasses and exams have clinics every month where they complete an exam and issue vouchers for eyeglasses. High Fall Risk? Nervous About Being Home Alone?

Medical Alert systems are a useful tool in calling for help. You wear a pendant as a watch or a necklace and in the event you have an emergency or need assistance you simply press a button. Most recently, Lifeline has developed a fall detector embedded in the pendant so if you were to pass out or lose consciousness and fall down, it would auto alert. This is highly recommended for anyone who is alone for an hour or more daily. Lifeline services can be reached at 800 543-3546. Or many other alert services are available.



Have a Driver but Unable to Pay Them?

VVTA has a program for transportation reimbursement. The program TRIP is a member driven, flexible program that allows for family or friends to transport while getting reimbursed for their mileage. Home Dialysis

Home dialysis, whether it is peritoneal dialysis or home hemodialysis, offers many benefits. There is more travel freedom, less diet and fluid restrictions. It offers the comfort of your own home on your schedule. It provides more regular dialysis with typically less pull which for the average patient means they have more energy consistently and less fluid and toxins being carried. Talk with your nephrologist to see if home dialysis is a good option for you.

Update Phone Number and Address

Please keep your dialysis center updated with new phone numbers and addresses. Also if there are any changes in your emergency contacts or their phone numbers. We have repeatedly had difficulty reaching people who have not given update information. This is important in the event of chair time/schedule changes, emergency events, transportation, and transplant requests.


Safety Net Grants

American Kidney Fund is still accepting grant applications. Their grant is to assist patients with dialysis related expenses. Limit of \$100 per year per patient. Talk to your social worker about applying for assistance paying for medications, transportation, or other health related expenses. For those who have applied already, there is a delay in processing.
